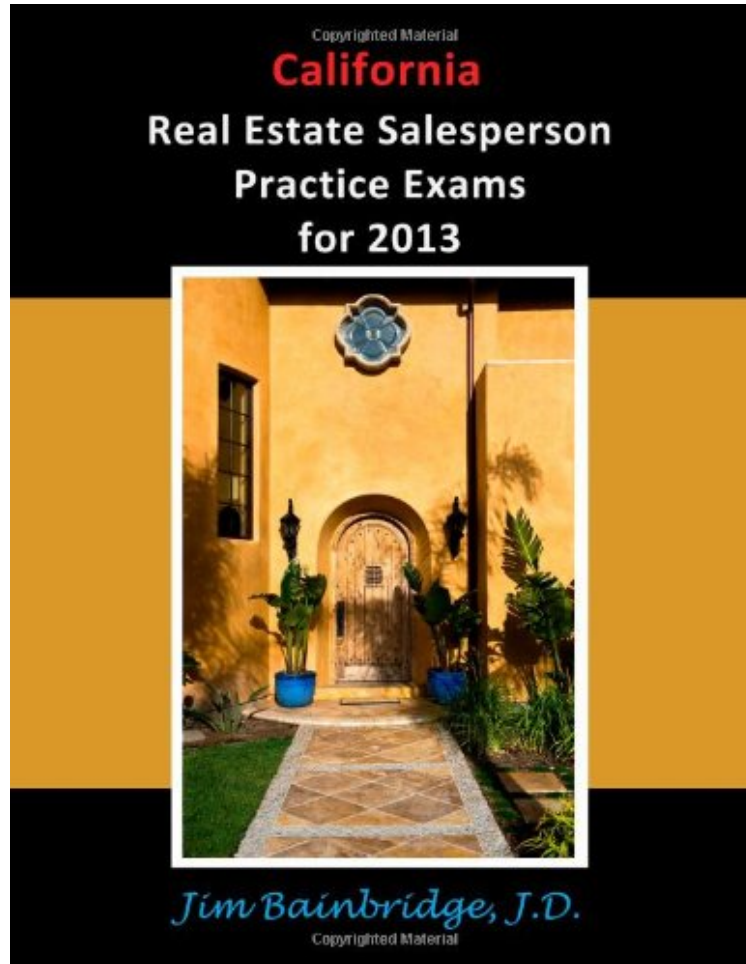

Practice tests questions were very similar to those on state licensing exam By SpongeHateWorldI studied diligently for my state exam, which was going to be in 3 days. I already took my pre-licensing courses, did very well, and also already went through other real estate licensing preparation books. I always felt the trick to passing standardized tests was just to prepare specifically for them, so feeling the need to do some more practice tests, I bought the kindle version of this book. I did not use California Real Estate Principles and License Preparation, the prep book that supplements these practice exams. My review is on the practice exams only. The first practice test I took, I failed. I was really shocked because I did well on the practice tests on my other prep books. I realized that my other prep book emphasized general real estate concepts, but it did not prepare me for

the CALIFORNIA state exam. With only 3 days left before my exam, I made flash cards of all the definitions in this book (~400 words), memorized them, studied more state-specific not covered in my other prep books, and finished the rest of the practice exams. I passed the practice tests but was skeptical about how I would do on the actual exam. To my surprise, **MANY QUESTIONS ON THE STATE EXAM ARE VERY SIMILAR TO QUESTIONS ON THE PRACTICE EXAMS IN TERMS OF MATERIAL COVERED, CONCEPTS, AND DIFFICULTY.** I ended up passing the state exam on the first try and, I can honestly say, I would not have been able to do it without this book. 14 of 14 people found the following review helpful. Using only this book I passed my California Real Estate exam. By Mariah I used ONLY this book (I did not spend any money on expensive review courses) and I passed by test, so I really have no choice but to give it a 5 star. On my particular test, there were zero math questions, although the review is good because you don't want to look like an idiot in front of a client if you have to do real estate math calculations. I memorized the vocabulary, I took the practice tests and then carefully reviewed the ones that I missed (making flash cards and using google for terms in the test that I did not fully understand) and that was it. I took the first test "cold" without studying and only got a 51%, but then I studied and by test 3 I was in the high 70's. Oh, and I did the whole thing in 2 weeks from start to finish before test time. 6 of 6 people found the following review helpful. Just passed the RE Exam. By Sean Yesterday I passed the RE exam. I like another person who wrote a review only had three days to study for the exam. I took the first test and got a 51%. Studied all the answers and took the next exam, 55%. The third exam, another 50ish%. With less than 24 hours to the exam I made note cards with all the items in the glossary, all the exam questions including why the wrong answers were wrong. Well, it worked. A+ for this book. If you want to pass buy this book learn every bit of it and you will pass!
