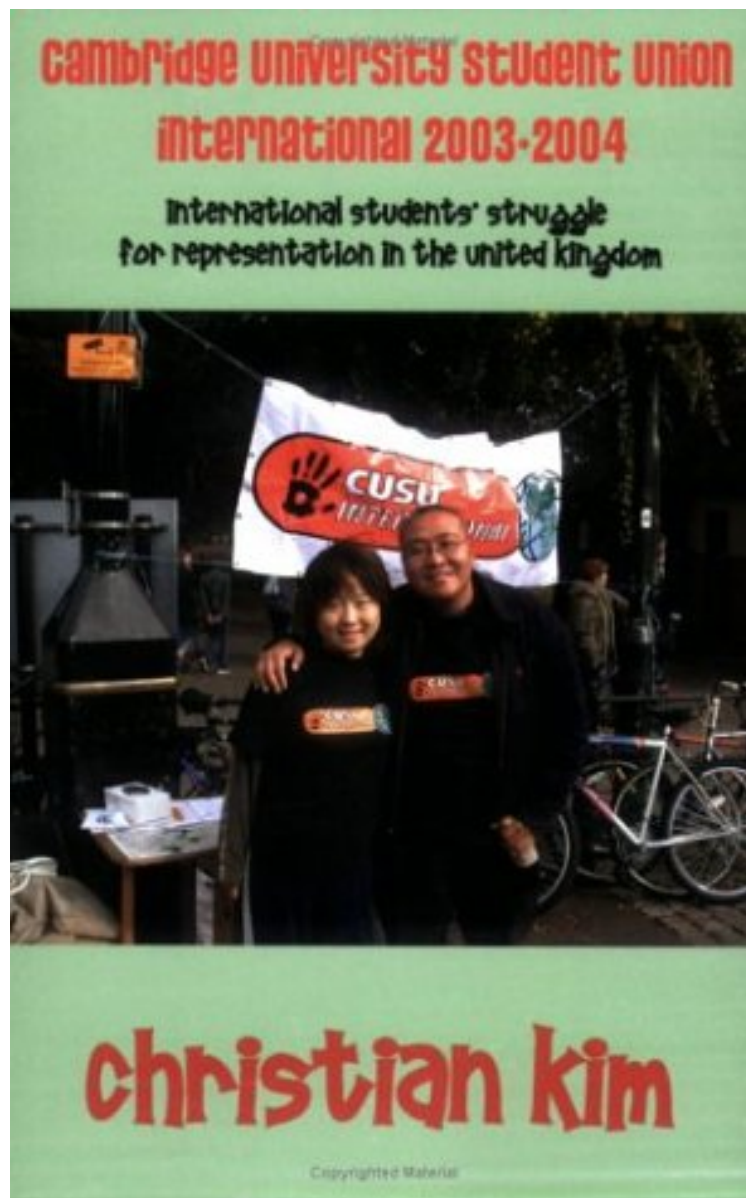

Christian Kim has faced a lot of discrimination from Jews during his time at Cambridge; I will give one example below:In May 2003, Christian Kim ran for the position of vice president of the Jesus Graduate Society against Anthony Cox. The election was held and the amount of votes for each candidate was never disclosed and Christian Kim was denied an independent scrutineer to monitor the counting. The only information given by the 'teller for election' was that Anthony Cox won. I was informed by an 'insider' that Christian Kim actually won the election but the 'outgoing' committee did not want him to get into power so they simply 'covered up' the result. One of the reasons for this could be that some members of the graduate committee and friends were Jewish. Kim was ejected from the Squire Law Library for harassing women. I had the misfortune to read the emails which he sent to one of my female friends, and they are just as objectionable as you might expect: not only does Kim apparently fantasize about raping girls, but he's stupid enough to tell them this. He seems to think that it's a good chat-up line. God help him . . .If anyone felt like bringing a prosecution against Kim for incitement to racial hatred, I'd be more than happy to get involved. His books certainly appear to qualify for this.It's also worth noting that every single positive review is written by Kim, writing under a variety of pseudonyms. As evidence for this, I point you to the fact that every positive review (with, admittedly, one exception) is written by a reviewer with either A) no other reviews or B) reviews exclusively of Kim's books. The positive reviews all read identically (look for phrases such as 'people of colour', which Kim is particularly fond of), and are written under a number of highly unconvincing pseudonyms (Phillippe Christophe from Paris, France, anyone?).I repeat: avoid this book. Avoid buying it, avoid giving Kim any money, avoid giving Kim your name, address, email, or phone number, time of day, etc. Avoid Kim. He is lecherous and quite possibly dangerous.
