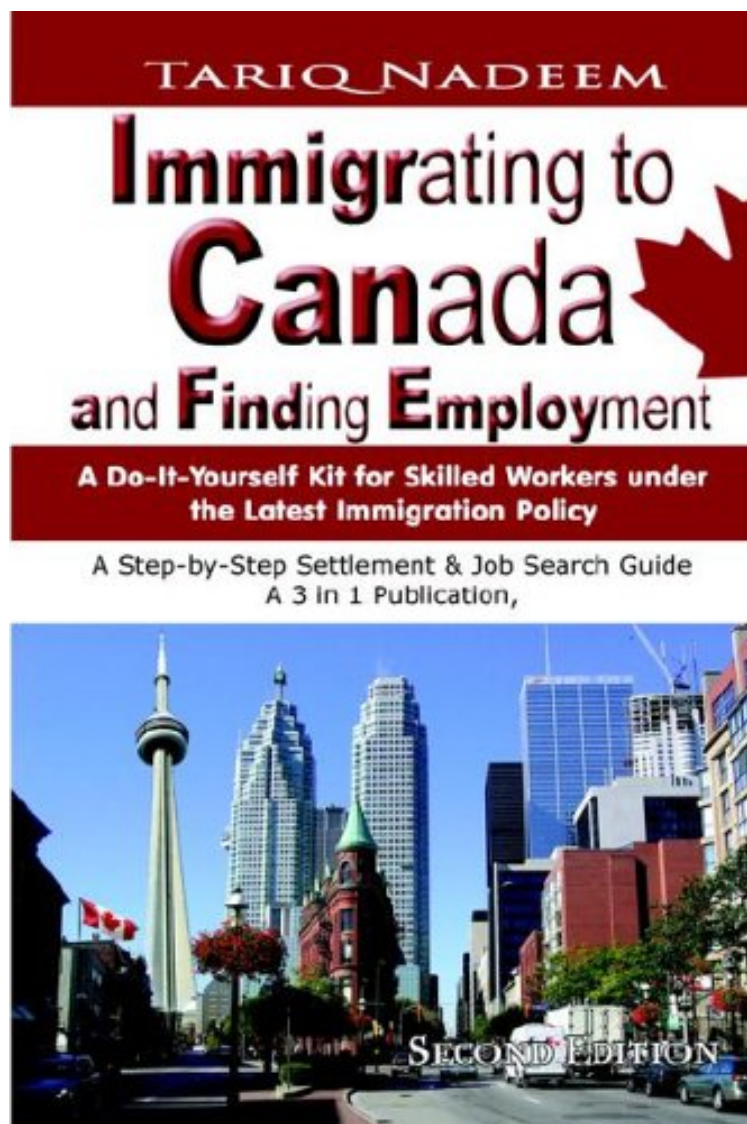

Home to two official languages, English and French, Canada is also a multicultural society, with more than 17% of the population reporting a mother tongue other than English or French. During the 1990s, Canada received between 200,000 and 250,000 immigrants per year. In 2001, Canada actually exceeded its target for the first time in years with 250,346 newcomers

being granted permanent resident status. This limit will be increased up to 300,000 per year to offset Canadas aging population to synchronize it to 1% of the total population. 50% of all the newcomers come to Toronto, 15% go to Vancouver and 11% to Montreal.
