In addition to the structures that carried out the program (Congress, the Departments of State, Justice, Labor and Agriculture, and the Immigration and Naturalization Service), she looked at the impact of the individual actors in those agencies and the interest groups they served. The ups and downs of administrative discretion, Congressional oversight and conflicting roles of agencies is not unlike many of the issues that exist today, with illegal immigrants replacing the braceros. Connecting structural contradictions in the political economy to the details of agency decision-making, "Inside the State" aims to provide in-depth analyses of the links between abstract theories of the state and real-life political actors and institutions.
