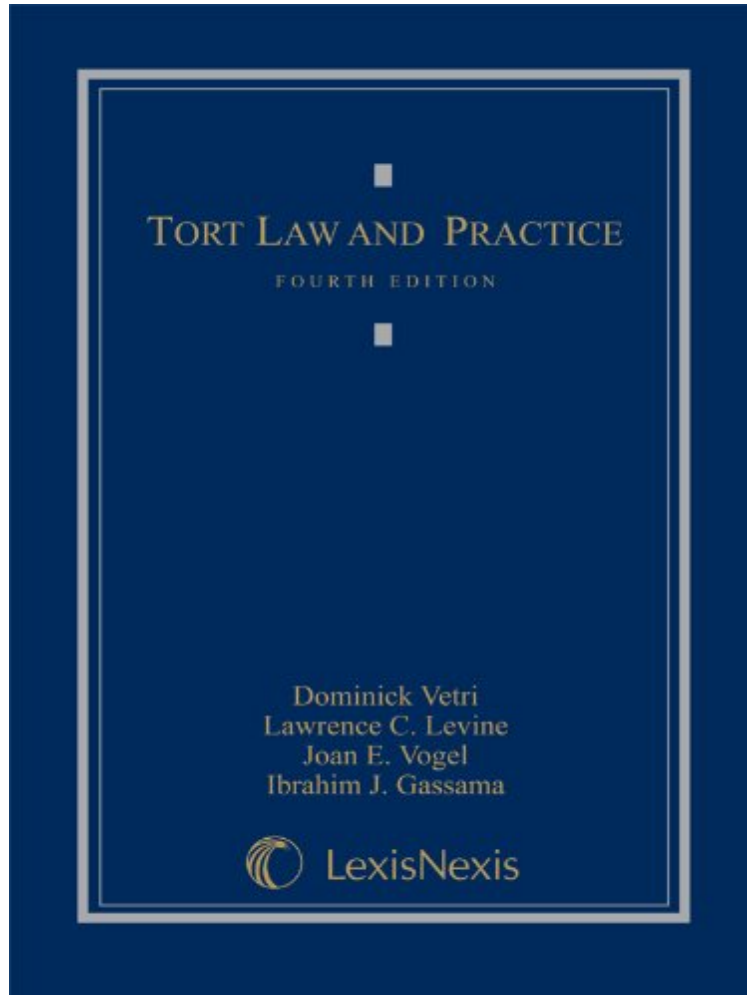

Whereas my contracts and criminal law casebooks have useful notes with additional information, this one too often has series of questions as notes. It's seriously annoying, offensive even. I mean, you're reading your very first casebook, and you get to the end of your first concept, and they're asking you incessant questions? Whereas I keep my pencil ready for the notes in the other casebooks, this one I scan for question marks and skip text wherever I see them. Lots of wasted print, as far as I'm concerned. Save the questions for sections clearly marked as hypos or problems -- and use those sparingly. Above all, get the questions out of the places where a student is expecting to be taught the law.
