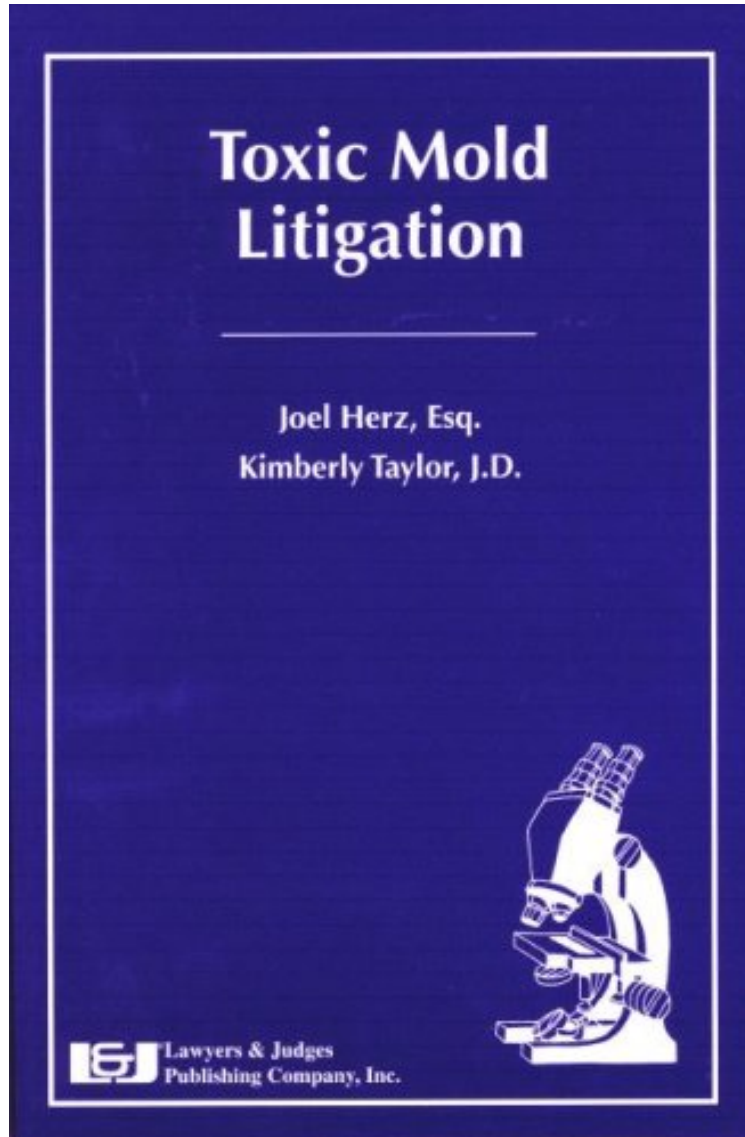

It provides critical background information to put the mold issue in context, including information on exposure, illness, allergic reactions, types of claims filed in mold litigation, and insurance issues.
