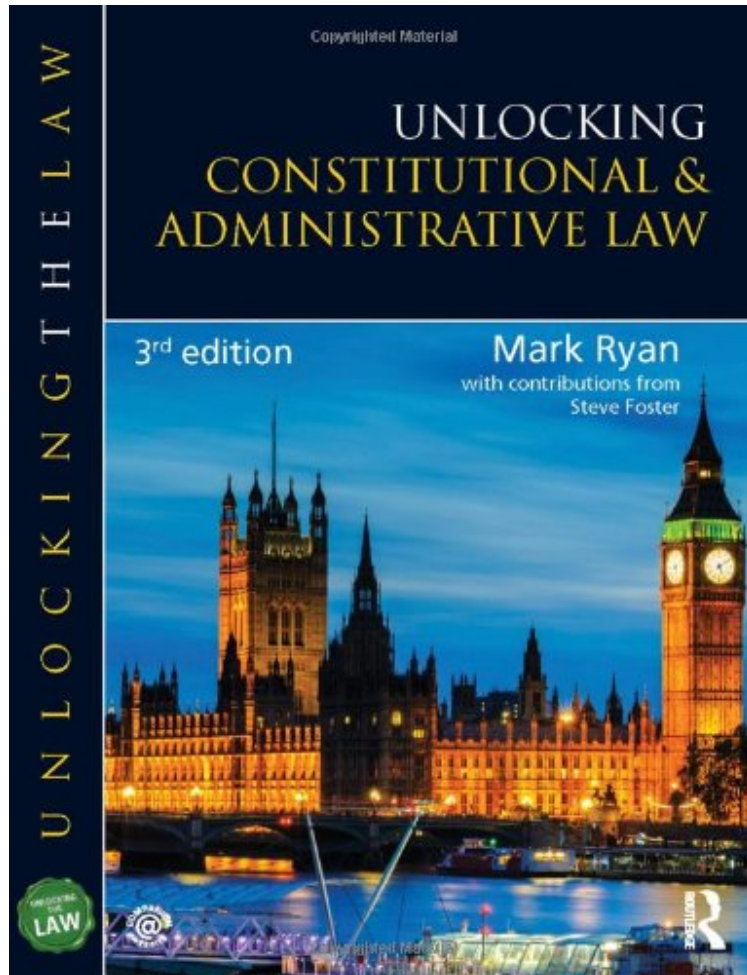

Green Chambers Mark Ryan and Steve Foster have produced an excellent statement of the main points of study for both constitutional and administrative law (always linked together at this level) catering for undergraduates looking for a departure from the traditional law texts available. The section on human rights matters is of particular assistance to those new to this area of law. We also consider that this book has a much wider potential readership for anyone interested in the development of this topical law area.
