It is very simply written, easy to understand, and basic when it comes to understanding the US Constitution. If you don't know what is in this book, you do not know the Constitution. If you have not really studied the Constitution this is the place to start. If you have studied it greatly but need a quick reference this is it. You just cannot beat this book for a fundamental explanation of our great document.Be aware that the book has almost nothing in the way of explanation of the various clauses of the Constitution. The book quotes the clause, gives a one or two sentence explanation of why the clause was put into the Constitution or why it was changed (the Amended parts are either crossed out or shown as added) and that is about it. You really cannot get more basic. I have written The Super Summary of World History (available on )The Super Summary of World History: and I probably say more about why the document was written as it was than this book - and my explanations take up about one page. union' refers to the first colonies that wanted to form their own governments, currency, etc. similar to the many countries in Europe.
